Description of the workshop: Papers presented at this interdisciplinary and international symposium that focuses on health care governance and regulation will be published by a new journal, *Regulation and Governance*, in October 2007. A workshop is to be held at the University of Wisconsin on March 2, 2007 that will feature the papers to be published in the special issue. The papers are organized in a series of sessions that are organized around health care regulatory sites and systems: medical research, hospitals, medical practice, and national systems. The session participants are the paper writers and commentators. Each paper explores an alternative set of regulatory tools and mechanisms currently being utilized or envisioned in these arenas, such as public/private collaboration, consumer participation, industrial standardization and new types of courts. In some cases there are competing alternatives in a single arena, in other cases the alternatives may co-exist with the traditional regulatory structures. The papers will be presented in short overviews with responses by University of Wisconsin researchers and Wisconsin practitioners. Each session will allow for ample discussion.
